



## Student Expense Budgets 2009-2010

Law School tuition fellowship is based on the following standard Law School budgets and assumes on-campus residency.

Single student budgets are used for determining federal aid eligibility, regardless of marital status. Allowances are made against income and resources to compensate for cost differences for married students, married students with children and single parents.

Living allowance includes rent, food and personal expenses. NOTE: An incremental living allowance will be added to the first year student budget to cover expenses for earlier quarter start date.

Childcare costs are not included in any of the budgets listed above. However, childcare costs may be added in full to the loan budget and a maximum of \$227 per week per child may be added to the fellowship budget.

\*All health insurance rates are for single students only. For married couples, we assume the spouse will have coverage from an employer. Family coverage rates are available and adjustments can be made to the loan budget with documentation. Please note that insurance rates are for three quarters only.
