In December 2010, Congress passed legislation that determined the gift and estate tax law for 2010 – 2012 (\$5 million exemption, with added flexibility in 2010 for decedent's estates). If Congress does nothing, the exemption will return to \$1 million in 2013 with an increased tax rate. Will Congress ever pass a more comprehensive approach to estate and gift taxes? If so, what is it likely to be? More importantly, how should one plan state affairs under these circumstances? B. Howard Pearson, BS '76, Development Legal Counsel and Senior Philanthropic Advisor, Stanford University Office of Development, and Lecturer in Law, teaches estate planning and will lead this information session on estate planning techniques under the current law and what may change in the future. - Bargaining with Baseball

Professor of Law Emeritus William B. Gould IV

In 1995, William B. Gould IV, then chairman of the National Labor Relations Board, cast the deciding vote to obtain the injunction that ended the longest strike in baseball history. Seventeen years of peaceful relations between baseball labor and management have followed, as well as unprecedented prosperity in a relationship that had just endured 30 years of strikes and lockouts. William B. Gould IV, Charles A. Beardesley Professor of Law, Emeritus, will discuss his study, which clearly illustrates the practical impact of law on America's pastime, considers the 140-year sweep of labor-management relationships and conflict, exploring player-owner disputes, the development of free agency, the collective bargaining process, and the racial integration of baseball, among other topics. Professor Gould will conclude with a discussion of the "steroids era," the problem with maintaining Jackie Robinson's legacy in the 21st century, and globalization.

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

Fred Cate, JD '87

Distinguished Professor and C. Ben Dutton Professor of Law; Director, Center for Applied Cybersecurity Research, Indiana University

Professor Cate specializes in information privacy and security law issues. He speaks frequently about these issues before industry, professional, and government groups and testifies regularly before Congress.

He is a senior policy advisor to the Centre for Information Policy Leadership at Hunton & Williams LLP, a member of Microsoft's Trustworthy Computing Academic Advisory Board, Intel's Privacy and Security External Advisory Board, the Department of Homeland Security Cybersecurity Committee, the Department of Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency Privacy Oversight Board, the Board of Directors of the International Foundation for Online Responsibility, and the Board of Directors of the Kinsey Institute for Research in Sex, Gender and Reproduction.

Cate is the author of more than 150 books and articles, including *The Internet and the First Amendment*, *Privacy in the Information Age*, and *Privacy in Perspective*, and he appears frequently in the popular press.

Ivan K. Fong, JD '87

General Counsel of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Washington, DC

Ivan K. Fong was confirmed by the U.S. Senate and sworn in as General Counsel of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security in May 2009. As General Counsel, Fong is the chief legal officer for the third largest federal government department, advising Secretary Napolitano and her senior leadership on all significant legal, policy, and operational issues and overseeing over 1,800 lawyers in the Department's headquarters and its seven operating components: Customs and Border Protection (CBP); Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE); Transportation Security Administration (TSA); U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS); U.S. Coast Guard; and U.S. Secret Service.

Fong was previously the Chief Legal Officer & Secretary of Cardinal Health, Inc.; Senior Vice President & General Counsel of GE Vendor Financial Services; and GE's first Chief Privacy Leader and Senior Counsel, Information Technology. Fong has also previously served as Deputy Associate Attorney General at the U.S. Department of Justice; partner with Covington & Burling in Washington, D.C.; and law clerk to Justice Sandra Day O'Connor of the U.S. Supreme Court.

William B. Gould IV

Charles A. Beardsley Professor of Law, Emeritus

A prolific scholar of labor and discrimination law, William B. Gould IV has been an influential voice on worker-management relations for more than forty years and served as chairman of the National Labor Relations Board. Professor Gould has been a member of the National Academy of Arbitrators since 1970 and has arbitrated and mediated more than 200 labor disputes, including the 1992 and 1993 salary disputes between the Major League Baseball Players Association and the Major League Baseball Player Relations Committee. He served as Independent Monitor for FirstGroup America, addressing freedom of association complaints (2008-2011). Professor Gould has acted as Special Advisor to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (2011-2012).

Professor Gould is the recipient of five honorary doctorates for his significant contributions in the fields of labor law and labor relations. Before joining the Stanford Law School Faculty in 1972, he was a professor of law at Wayne State University Law School and was an attorney for the National Labor Relations Board, as well as for United Auto Workers.

Pamela S. Karlan

Kenneth and Harle Montgomery Professor of Public Interest Law and Co-Director, Supreme Court Litigation Clinic, Stanford Law School

A productive scholar and award-winning teacher, Pamela S. Karlan is also co-director of the school's Supreme Court Litigation Clinic, where students litigate live cases before the Court. One of the nation's leading experts on voting and the political process, she has served as a commissioner on the California Fair Political Practices Commission and an assistant counsel and cooperating attorney for the NAACP Legal Defense Fund. Professor Karlan is the co-author of three leading casebooks on constitutional law, constitutional litigation, and the law of democracy, as well as more than sixty scholarly articles.

B. Howard Pearson, BS '76

Development Legal Counsel and Senior Philanthropic Advisor at Stanford University and Lecturer at Stanford Law School

B. Howard Pearson, BS '76 is the development legal counsel and Senior Philanthropic Advisor at Stanford University and a lecturer at Stanford Law School where he teaches two courses: Trusts and Estates, and Estate Planning. After graduating from Stanford, he attended law school at the University of Utah (JD '79). He joined the firm of Brobeck, Phleger & Harrison, where he was an associate and partner in the field of estate planning for fifteen years before joining Stanford in 1995. Pearson has served regularly on panels and committees of the American, State and local Bar Associations and the Practicing Law Institute and, for many years, was co-editor of California Probate Practice, Matthew Bender.

Marc Rotenberg, JD '87

Executive Director of the Electronic Privacy Information Center (EPIC), Washington, DC

Marc Rotenberg is founder and president of the Electronic Privacy Information Center (EPIC), a non-profit research and litigation center established in Washington, DC in 1994. Rotenberg also teaches information privacy law and a FOIA clinic at Georgetown University Law Center. He frequently testifies before Congress and files amicus briefs on emerging privacy and civil liberties issues, and is often quoted in the national media. He has served on several national and international advisory panels. He is also active in Internet policy and is a former Chair of the Public Interest Registry, which manages the .ORG domain. Rotenberg is editor of "Privacy and Human Rights", "The Privacy Law Sourcebook", and "Litigation Under the Federal Open Government Laws".

Kent Walker, JD '87

Senior Vice President and General Counsel at Google Inc.

Kent Walker is responsible for managing Google's global legal team and advising the company's board and management on legal issues.

Before joining Google, Walker held senior legal positions at a number of leading technology companies. Most recently he was Deputy General Counsel of eBay Inc., where he managed corporate legal affairs, litigation, and legal operations. Previously, he was Executive Vice President of Liberate Technologies, a leading provider of interactive services software founded by Oracle and Netscape Communications. He also served as Associate General Counsel for Netscape and America Online and Senior Counsel for AirTouch Communications, which was later acquired by Vodafone.

Earlier in his career, Walker was an Assistant U.S. Attorney with the United States Department of Justice, where he specialized in the prosecution of technology crimes and advised the Attorney General on management and technology issues.
